Polite Expression

Excuse me.... Pardon me....

 bump into someone, get someone's attention, interrupt someone, and ask for information:

Ex: Excuse me, could you tell me the way to the station?

Excuse me, is anyone sitting here?

In American English **Pardon me** and **Excuse me** for apologies:

Ex: Excuse me/Pardon me, I didn't see you there.

In British English you say: Pardon? Sorry?
In American English you say: Pardon me?
Excuse me?

2. not hear or understand and want them to repeat it:

Ex: Pardon, could you say that again?

Sorry...

Apologize for something small: Sorry I'm late.

I'm sorry...

when you made a mistake, or for any inconvenience: I'm sorry, but do you think you could move your car?

Please...

- 1. In British English it introduces or ends a request: Please could I have the menu?

 Could I have the menu, please?
- 2. Ask somebody to do something:

 Move this table for me, please.

Thank You ...

You say Thank you or Yes when you want to accept something:

"How about another cup of coffee?"

"Thank you."/ "Thanks."/ "Yes, please."

You say "No, thank you." / "No, thanks" When you want to refuse: "Would you like some more cake?" "No, thank you." / "No, thanks"

There are different expressions that you can use to respond to thank you:

You're welcome. - basic

My pleasure. - expresses that you were happy to do it

Don't mention it. - informal At your service. - ยินดีช่วยเสมอ No bother at all. - ไม่เป็นไรน่า

Cheers...

Cheers is often used in informal British English to mean Thank you:

'Here's that \$5 I owe you.' 'Oh, cheers.'

Bless you...

This is a polite expression used after someone sneezes.

*Use: Would you mind if I...? Could I possibly...? Could you possibly...?

Do you think you could...? to sound more polite.

*Remember: "Do you mind...?" "Would you mind...?" mean "Is it a problem for you?" So the polite answer when we "say yes" is "No".

Polite expression: Apology การขอโทษ & Forgiveness การยกโทษ

Excuse me. 'Scuse me.

I'm sorry. Sorry.

Sorry about that. Pardon me.

I must apologize. I didn't mean to.

I apologize for being late.

Excuse me for my smoking here.

Please excuse me for coming late.

Please forgive me. I really didn't mean that.

Respond to Apology & Forgiveness

การตอบรับคำขอโทษ:

Not at all. Never mind about that.

It doesn't matter. Not to worry. (ไม่ต้องกังวลหรอก)

No worries. It's nothing. (ไม่เป็นไรครับ)

Don't sweat it. Please don't worry about it (that).

Forget it. No harm. (ไม่มีอะไร้ายแรงหรอก)

No problem. No harm done. (ก็ไม่มีอะไรเสียหายนี่ครับ)

I quite understand. That's all right. (ไม่เป็นไรครับ)

Don't let it happen again. That's OK.

Forgiveness: ยกโทษ

I didn't mean to hurt your feelings.

Sue: Well, I know now that you didn't mean to hurt my feelings.

Yes, I'll forgive you.

Forgiveness: ยกโทษ
